• **Other Major Curricular Developments**

1. In 2010, I led the effort to combine two bachelor degrees (B.S. Health Management and Policy and B.S. Health Promotion and Health Behavior) into one degree with two transcript visible options (B.S. Public Health, option in Health Management and Policy, option in Health Promotion and Health Behavior). This (Category 1) transformation involved garnering support from public health faculty from the two degree programs, working with faculty to select a core set of courses that students from both options would complete, and working with advisors to implement the degree change while minimizing student progress.
2. In 2015, I led the development of the accelerated graduate program (AGP) for undergraduate students to apply to the MPH in health management and policy during their junior year.
3. In AY2013-14 and AY 2014-15 I was invited by the Dean of the College of Public Health and Human Sciences to chair a Task Force on MPH Core Curriculum Integration. This college-wide effort involved stakeholders from different units and challenged the status quo on what is considered core public health knowledge and how we deliver it. The task force completed its charge and presented the overall design of the new integrated core curriculum to the Public Health Faculty, Dean, and Administrative Team in June, 2015. The MPH Integrative Core Curriculum Development Team, of which I am a member, is working to develop the components of the new core curriculum and we expect to pilot the new curriculum in AY2017-18.

I served as Director of the Health Management and Policy programs (BS, MPH, and PhD) from 2004-2016. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to implementing curricular changes for the BS, MPH and PhD program, developing the schedule of health management and policy courses to be offered, providing teaching assignment recommendations to School Heads, serving as liaison to the Oregon Master of Public Health program (from 2004-2014), assisting with the preparation of materials for CEPH accreditation, maintaining relationships with AUPHA, leading AUPHA recertification effort, working with other Coordinators in public health and in the College on graduate program issues, meeting with current graduate students, communicating with and recruiting graduate applicants, and working with the undergraduate advisors on behalf of the health management and policy program.

The Undergraduate program was fully certified by the AUPHA. In 2013, the B.S. Health Management and Policy degree was required to submit a self-study for recertification. Our program was awarded full re-certification for the maximum 6 years and our program's self-study is used by AUPHA as a model self-study.
