Primary Aim: With this administrative supplement, we will conduct a mixed-methods study to guide decisions about terminology used for assessing gender within the Healthy Oregon Project. We will:
a. Conduct individual cognitive interviews with 20 transgender and gender diverse (TGD) and 10 cisgender participants to i) test and refine terminology for assessment and response options, ii) identify supplementary questions that promote inclusivity, and iii) allow for assessment of gender fluidity.

b. Hold 4 focus groups (of 7-8 individuals each) in which participants pilot test and provide feedback to further refine survey items.
c. Implement the revised items using a new survey module with the HOP to evaluate response rates and reported gender across age group, sex assigned at birth, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, and rural/urban dwelling.

d. Convene a community advisory group to disseminate results and discuss recommendations.
