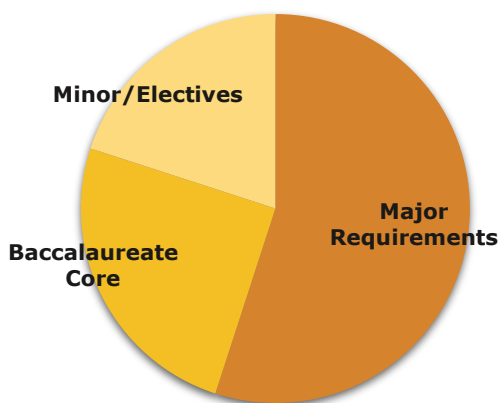

Nutrition (NUTR)

The undergraduate Nutrition (BS) program at Oregon State University focuses on the role of diet and nutrition in human health. Food is fundamentally important to human life, health and pleasure. Learn about the science of nutrition, the role of food and nutrition and how we can maximize our health by making better dietary choices. The future demand for food, nutrition and dietetics professionals is strong.

The field provides diverse career opportunities in healthcare organizations, community and public health, grocery stores, food systems and industry, restaurants, schools, and wellness and fitness, as well as media, communications and technology. Private practice and self-employment in the field continues to grow as graduates design new and exciting career directions.

Your Bachelor's Degree (BS) in the College of Public Health & Human Sciences



- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation; 60 must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 124 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 can be accepted.
- Some courses can count towards your major and the Baccalaureate Core. Check with your advisor.

Important Notes for the College and Major:

- Grade requirements: C- minimum for all major required courses and only two attempts total will be allowed, see <https://health.oregonstate.edu/advising/resources/policies> for more information.
- See a sample degree plan by searching "Nutrition" at admissions.oregonstate.edu/find-your-major
- Option required. Select from: Dietetics, Nutrition and Foodservice Systems, Nutrition Health Sciences.
- Other similar majors to explore: Biology, Chemistry, Biochemistry, BioHealth Sciences, Food Systems Technology.
- Chemistry and some Baccalaureate Core are priority courses to complete before transferring to OSU.
- For Nutrition students, the best time to transfer is Fall term, particularly due to the Nutrition series courses. Talk with an OSU advisor about your specific timeline.
- It is important to speak with your SWOCC & OSU Academic Advisor early on, and often, to ensure correct course selection and sequencing.

Resources and OSU Information:

- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree in order to transfer to OSU.
 - If you've completed the Oregon AAOT, all requirements of the Baccalaureate Core are complete except for Synthesis Courses and Writing Intensive Courses.
