## Kapi'olani Community College Transfer Guide

*The Kinesiology major prepares students for careers in physical activity and fitness/wellness such as organizing, directing or managing physical fitness programs; personal trainer; fitness instructor; exercise physiologist; strength and fitness coach; and fitness entrepreneur.*

*The degree can also serve as preparation for applications to a master's level physical education teacher education program, medical school, a professional program in the allied health professions (e.g. physical or occupational therapy, nursing, physician assistant) or other graduate education.*

### Kinesiology

Physical activity is essential to good health, disease prevention and increasing human performance, and our popular and nationally recognized programs will help you be a leader in improving quality of life through safe exercise and organized sport.

### Pre-Therapy and Allied Health (PTAH)

The Pre-Therapy and Allied Health (PTAH) option, within the Kinesiology major, will prepare you for admission into professional preparation programs in the allied health fields, including physical therapy, occupational therapy, nursing, physician assistant studies and medical school.

## Important Notes and Contacts

- Students are required to complete certain pre-requisites before adding the PTAH option. Talk to an OSU advisor for more details.
- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree to transfer to OSU. Following the sample two-year plan can help ease the transfer.

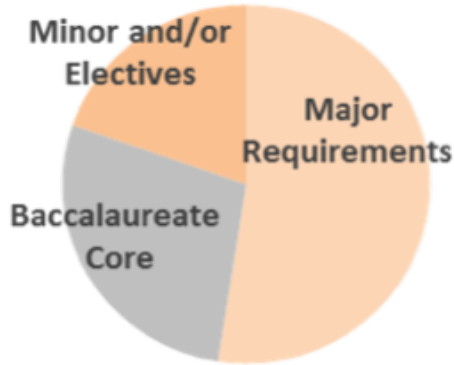

## Kapi'olani Community College Transfer Guide

### Your Bachelor's Degree at OSU



- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation.
- 60 of the 180 credits must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 124 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 can be accepted.

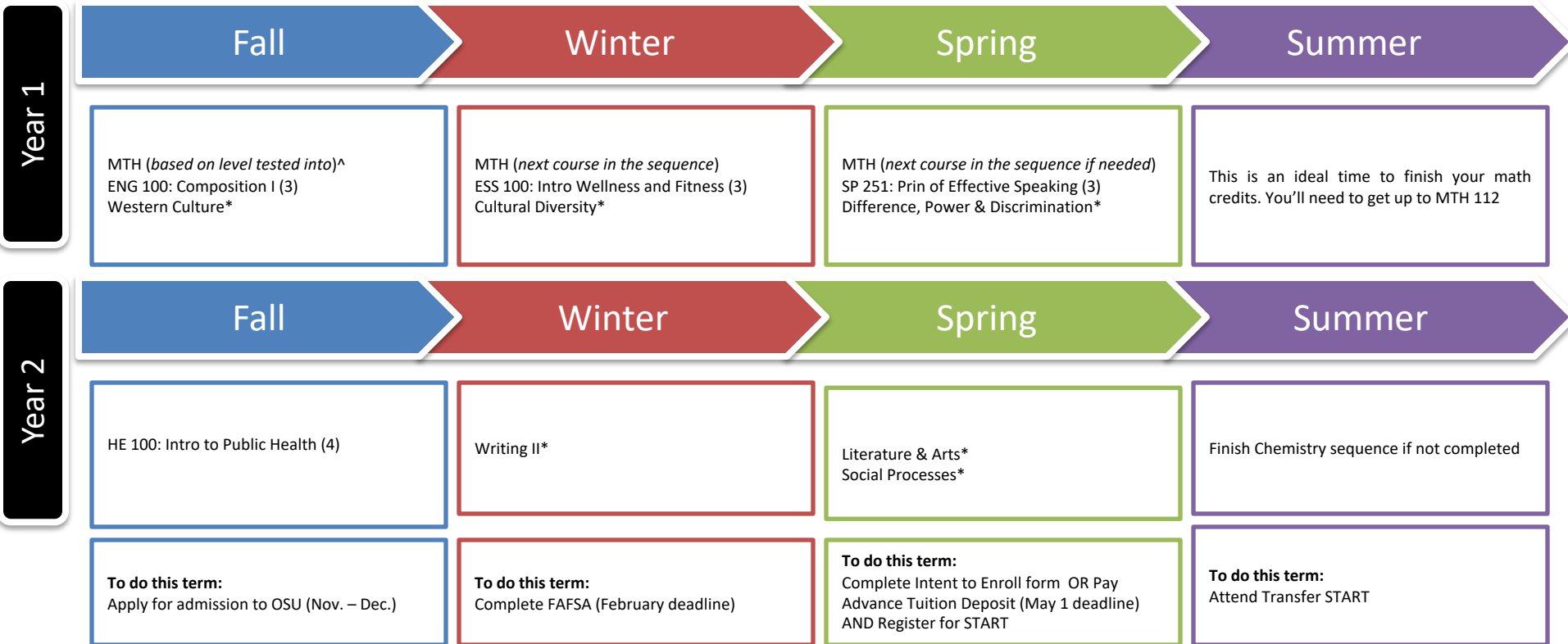
### General Education Courses (also called Baccalaureate Core)

- Complete one course in each Perspectives category with no more than two in the same department.
- The Oregon AAOT satisfies all lower division requirements of the Baccalaureate Core (all but Synthesis Courses\*).
- The College of Public Health and Human Sciences allows courses to double count between your major and the Baccalaureate Core.
