OSU Pre-Public Health Hawai'i Community College Transfer Guide

We offer one of the few undergraduate public health programs in the country and are gaining momentum and enthusiasm as the first college of public health in Oregon. Public health professionals prevent disease and protect and promote health within groups of people, from small communities to entire populations. At our college, public health is integrated in all that we do as we strive to ensure health for every person, every family and every community. Our interdisciplinary approach, research centers and focus on both rural and urban health will enrich your educational experience and position you for beginning your career or continuing your public health education. As a student, you will take an ecological approach to disease prevention, including examining environmental issues, access to healthcare services, health policies, and social and contextual factors as determinants of health.

Human Services

By choosing the Health Management and Policy major option, you will learn about the management of public health and healthcare programs and agencies, and the analysis of public health policies. The program is right for you if you want to manage health programs in a wide range of institutions, both public and private, and is particularly well-suited for students interested in the business associated with the delivery and financing of health services. Health Promotion and Health Behavior

In the Health Promotion and Health Behavior you will learn a variety of skills and strategies that will provide you with the necessary proficiencies to improve population health in diverse settings. The program focuses on the social and behavioral determinants of health and disease across the lifespan, with a particular emphasis on health disparities. Upon graduation, you will be qualified to assist with planning, implementing and evaluating programs that address health disparities and that are intended to improve the health of diverse populations.

Important Notes and Contacts

- Students are required to complete 4 Pre-Public Health courses prior to admission into Public Health full major. These four courses must be completed with a “C” or better in each course and an averaged GPA of 3.0.
- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree to transfer to OSU. Following the sample two-year plan can help ease the transfer.

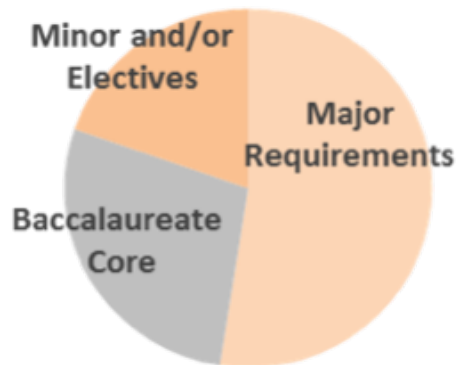

OSU Pre-Public Health Hawai'i Community College Transfer Guide

Your Bachelor's Degree at OSU



- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation.
- 60 of the 180 credits must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 124 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 can be accepted.

General Education Courses (also called Baccalaureate Core)

- Complete one course in each Perspectives category with no more than two in the same department.
- The Oregon AAOT satisfies all lower division requirements of the Baccalaureate Core (all but Synthesis Courses*).
- The College of Public Health and Human Sciences allows courses to double count between your major and the Baccalaureate Core.
