## B2. ADVISING TASK FORCES, WORKGROUPS, AND COALITIONS

I have been appointed to and served on several task forces, workgroups, and coalitions in an advisory role to provide research-based information, public health data, tools, and resources to help groups of community members and leaders make informed decisions about program development and community health improvement projects.

1. **Rural Communities Opioid Response Program (RCORP) Tillamook**—Since 2019, I have been a member of this workgroup to create a plan for opioid misuse treatment in Tillamook County, which has one of the highest rates of opioid overdose deaths in the state of Oregon. Adventist Health Tillamook received funding from the Health Human Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) RCORP planning grant and I participate as a partner due to my work on the “Coast to Forest” opioid prevention project. The products of this working group were (1) a needs assessment for opioid use disorder treatment and prevention and (2) a strategic plan to address those needs. Those two products were used to apply for a HRSA implementation grant in May 2020.
2. **Tillamook County Futures Council**—Since 2018, I have been a member of the Tillamook County Futures Council appointed by the Tillamook County Board of County Commissioners. The Futures Council supports county planning efforts by convening community conversations, facilitating citizen and stakeholder engagement, and assimilating broad-based citizen input to inform decision-making. Membership reflects the County’s Strategic Vision categories: economy, growth and development, natural environment, society and culture, youth and education, and health and human services. I represent the health and human services sector.
3. **Tillamook County Wellness**—Since 2016, I have been a member of the Tillamook County Wellness Advisory Committee (formerly the Task Force), and re-appointed annually by the Board of County Commissioners. In 2017, I became a member of the five-person leadership team that includes a county

commissioner, director of public health, Tillamook County Wellness coordinator, and Oregon Health and Sciences University North Coast Research Liaison. I also provide technical support to ten co-chairs of the five committees. Outcomes of my work include the creation of a framework to address diabetes, enhanced community collaboration, increased capacity through education and skill building, and the creation of five action teams to reduce risk factors for diabetes. Additionally, I facilitate monthly advisory council meetings, action committee chairs meetings, and chair the evaluation team that is developing an assessment plan to measure the impact of the coalition’s work.

4. **Emergency Volunteer Corps of Nehalem Bay (EVCNB) Food Task Force**—In 2018, this task force was assembled to provide recommendations for mass food storage in the communities of Wheeler, Manzanita, and Nehalem in preparation for a Cascadia Zone earthquake and tsunami. As a member of the task force, I provided guidance on emergency food stores.
5. **Greater Newport Area Vision 2040**—From 2017 to 2018 I served on the Vision 2040 task force in Lincoln County. I was appointed by the Newport City Council to provide guidance on the development of a twenty-year vision for the greater Newport area. The outcomes of my participation included a focus on health equity and a prevention focus that was integrated into the adopted vision and strategic plan.
6. **Lincoln County Community Health Improvement Plan Healthy Eating and Active Living Committee**—From 2016 to 2017, I provided guidance and advice on program development within the Lincoln County Department of Health and Human Services. The outcomes of this work included a GIS mapping project of food access in Lincoln County to identify areas for improved food access and public health services. Lincoln County Health and Human Services has integrated this into their Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP).

### B3. CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

**Linnell, J. D.,** Zidenberg-Cherr, S, & Smith, M. H. (2019). *Discovering Healthy Choices*. University of California Agriculture and Natural Resources: Davis, CA.

This curriculum was developed and tested between 2010 and 2015. It was developed as part of a comprehensive school nutrition intervention, the Shaping Healthy Choices Program, to improve dietary behaviors among fourth-grade youth. Between 2012 and 2014, the Shaping Healthy Choices Program was evaluated and resulted in improved knowledge and health outcomes (Scherr et al., 2017; Linnell et al., 2016). Additional research of teachers implementing the program indicated outcomes were related to level of implementation, teacher characteristics, and teacher self-efficacy (Linnell et al., 2016). In 2015, the Shaping Healthy Choices Program was accepted by the National Collaborative on Childhood Obesity Research and the USDA SNAP-Ed Toolkit as an approved intervention. This is significant because only approved interventions may be included in State SNAP-Ed program plans and implemented with SNAP-Ed funding.

The Shaping Healthy Choices Program was implemented and evaluated in three counties through the SNAP-Ed program in California (University of California CalFresh program) and found to be feasible for implementation through the CalFresh program throughout California (Bergman, et al., 2018). Subsequently, it was adopted by Cooperative Extension SNAP-Ed programs in 13 California counties and implemented in 96 classrooms. Additionally, it was adopted by 4-H programs in two California counties. The curriculum was peer-reviewed and published by University of California Agriculture and Natural Resources in 2019.
