Curriculum Development

H349, Peer Helper Skills Development

This is an undergraduate practicum course in public health delivered by Student Health Services staff to train students as a field experience practicum. Students are trained to peer leaders in delivering alcohol prevention and sexual health interventions. I led the redevelopment of this course in collaboration with Student Health Services staff to focus on college health issues and peer communication skills. (Development: Spring and Summer 2016; Currently delivered by Student Health Services)

H513, MPH Integrated Core Curriculum

This course involves a new philosophy, structure, and delivery modality to meet the 21st century public health professional needs. I have committed to team teach alongside instructors across core public health disciplines. This was a multiyear committee assignment to develop a 12 credit integrated core course for all incoming MPH students to address new CEPH learning objectives. Specifically, my expertise toward the course development covers social and behavioral sciences, qualitative methods, health promotion/health behavior, theory, and social determinants of health. (Submitted for curricular approval Winter 2017, developed in Spring and Summer 2017, delivered Fall 2017)

H513, MPH Integrated Core Curriculum- Hybrid

This course was developed as an innovative approach to team teach public health students the foundations of each public health discipline and how we work together to approach public health

of today. We adapted H513 to hybrid format using best practices for online and on-campus blending of instruction and improved upon the original design to utilize case-studies. Specifically, my expertise toward the course development covers social and behavioral sciences, qualitative methods, health promotion/health behavior, theory, and social determinants of health. Submitted for curricular approval Winter 2018, developed Spring and Summer 2018, delivered Fall 2018 and Fall 2019.

HHS513/ HHS514, MPH Integrated Core Curriculum- Online

These set of courses were adapted from the H513 hybrid version to online format using best practices for online instruction. These courses are the foundation for students completing the MPH Public Health Practice Online Degree. These two courses are the splitting of the 12 unit H513 course into two- 6 unit courses. Although the material will be parallel and similar to the H513 hybrid course, modifications were needed to create two stand-alone courses that were effective for online delivery and for shifting the Qualitative module all to HHS514. My expertise toward the course development covers social and behavioral sciences, qualitative methods, health promotion/health behavior, theory, and social determinants of health. While I was not the official instructor of record for this course, I was heavily involved in the delivery of the course, providing support, feedback, and course adjustments throughout the delivery terms. Submitted for curricular approval Winter 2018, developed Spring, Summer, Fall 2018, delivered for Fall 2018/Winter 2019 and Fall 2019/Winter 2020.

H364, Drugs, Society, and Human Behavior

This course focuses on the contemporary issues surrounding drugs and society. This course was last offered seven years ago and is being updated with current issues, incorporating individual and social determinants of health, and is being developed with instructional best practices. I mentored and assisted Dr. Dan Dowhower with the development of this undergraduate health promotion and health behavior elective course. Developed: Winter 2019; First term of delivery: Spring 2019

H225, Social and Individual Determinants of Health

This course introduces students on the interplay between social and individual determinants of health but focuses on social determinants of health and contemporary issues in public health. Over the past six years, I developed, taught, and updated the course each year to the meet the demands of highly relevant news that students were exposed to every day. I oversee and mentor GTAs who teach the various sections of H225. I am redeveloping the e-campus version of the course over Summer 2020.

H376, Evidence-Based Health Promotion

This course was recently developed to introduce students to research-tested public health programs that are effective for promoting health in community, clinical, and educational settings. Students develop the skills needed to critically examine evidence in the field and select effective programs to address current public health needs. I developed this course for online delivery with Ryan Singh, a graduate teaching assistant. First term of online delivery: Winter 2020.

H671, Advanced Theories of Health Behavior

This course provides doctoral students with in-depth examination of major theories in health behavior. I developed this course for students to also search and identify theories relevant to their topics of interest, how to develop midrange theories, and how to use and communicate the theoretical influences used in their conceptual models developed in the course. First term of delivery: Spring 2020 (delivered remotely due to covid-19)

H421, Mental Health

This course examines social, governmental/legal, and individual determinants of mental health. This course will be developed as an online elective. It will be developed over Winter and Spring 2021; First term of online delivery: Fall 2021.
