In collaboration with Liv Gifford, we wrote and published the completed all three pieces of the YA4-H! curriculum series: *YA4-H! Building Successful Youth-Adult Partnerships* (97 pages), *YA4-H! Teens as Teachers* (115 pages), and *YA4-H! Youth Participatory Action Research* (124 pages). The youth-adult partnerships and teens as teachers curricula were reviewed by the National 4-H Curriculum Jury and recommended for use nationally within the 4-H program. National 4-H Council has contracted with OSU to publish, market, and sell these curricula as part of the national 4-H collection, which will lead to high visibility for the curriculum and for the College of Public Health and Human Sciences and OSU Extension 4-H. In addition, both pieces were adopted for use with National 4-H Council's 4-H Food Smart Families Program (ConAgra). The curriculum has also been purchased by the Georgia 4-H program. The youth participatory action curriculum has been reviewed by the national jury and is currently under revision for re-submission and final approval. Completing these curricula was a necessary step in bringing the YA4-H! program to scale in Oregon, and has provided a solid base for the program to move forward to scale.
