CURRENT EXTENSION PROGRAM AND PROJECTS

Oregon SNAP-Ed Program

I am the lead principal investigator of the SNAP-Ed (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) education program, a \$7 million annual statewide program funded by USDA SNAP-Ed funds funneled through the Oregon Department of Human Services. The goal of the program is to improve the likelihood that persons eligible for SNAP will make healthy food choices within a limited budget and choose physically active lifestyles. This program includes nutrition education, health promotion, and intervention strategies in every county. I provide administrative leadership, including fiscal and human resource administration.

SNAP Outreach

OSU Extension FCH is a SNAP outreach provider, raising awareness of SNAP benefits and providing information about applying for benefits. I lead the administration of this project, which is implemented by OSU state and county faculty and staff on campus and in rural counties.

Walk with Ease

OSU Extension FCH coordinates the dissemination of this evidence-based physical activity program in every Oregon county. I am the lead principal investigator of this project, which is funded by the CDC and awarded to the Oregon Health Authority. There are three methods of dissemination: leader-led education series (3 times per week for 6 weeks); self-directed with optional support; and virtual series. New goals include automating the virtual series and fostering worksite wellness programs with state employees.
