

HOW MANY CHILDREN ARE SERVED BY OREGON'S CHILD CARE SUBSIDY?

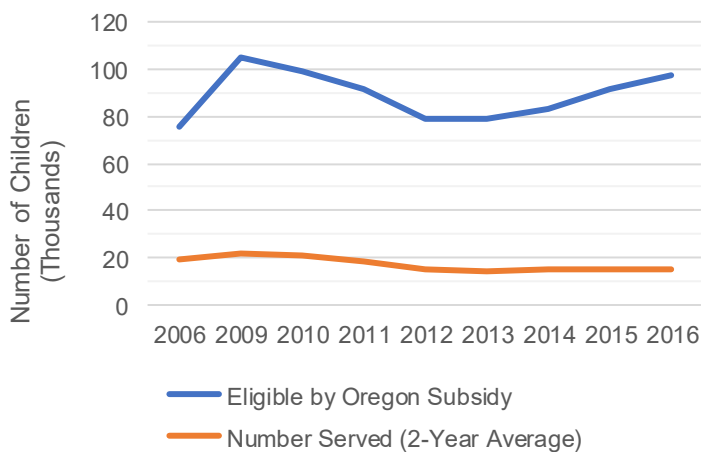

In 2017, the total number of Oregon children served by child care subsidy was **14,728**, which equates to **16%** of eligible children by Oregon Rules.

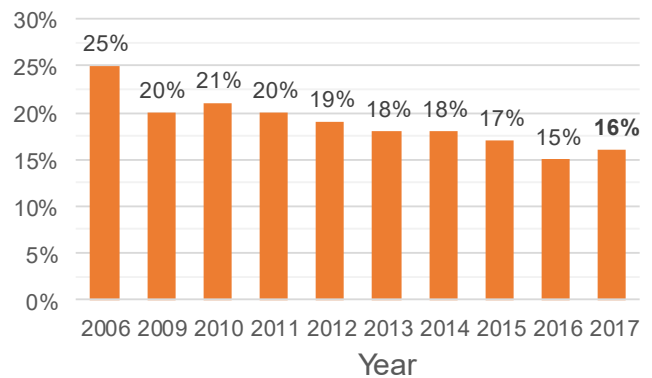
The percent of eligible children served by subsidy has declined by 10% over the last 10 years.
