

# What makes a food secure County?

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) defines *food security* as access at all times by all people within a household to enough food for an active, healthy life.

Community Food Security is defined as a "condition in which all community residents obtain a safe, culturally acceptable, nutritionally adequate diet through a sustainable food system that maximizes community self-reliance, social justice, and democratic decision-making (Hamm and Bellows, 2002)."

A **food secure county** would be a region where most of these conditions were true for a sustained period of time, for the majority of the county residents.

# Recommendations & Next Steps

### Food insecurity is a symptom

 Convene a cross-sector summit to align around intersectional issues and solutions

### Build and mobilize capacity across geography and organizations

• Staff a paid volunteer coordination role to increase volunteer capacity across service organizations, mobilizing formerly untapped volunteer populations (i.e. TCCA employees)

## Address stigma

- Mobile produce market with multiple payment options
- Pilot "open distribution" model for food assistance
- Duplicate study with Latinx participants- using bilingual/bicultural interviewers/researchers
