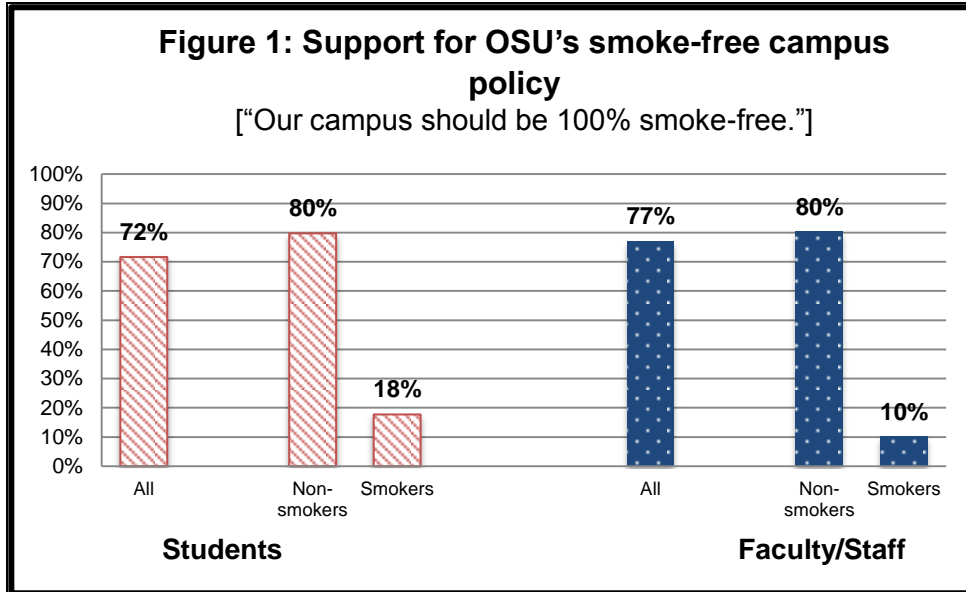


Graphs from the Evaluation of OSU's smoke-free Corvallis campus policy

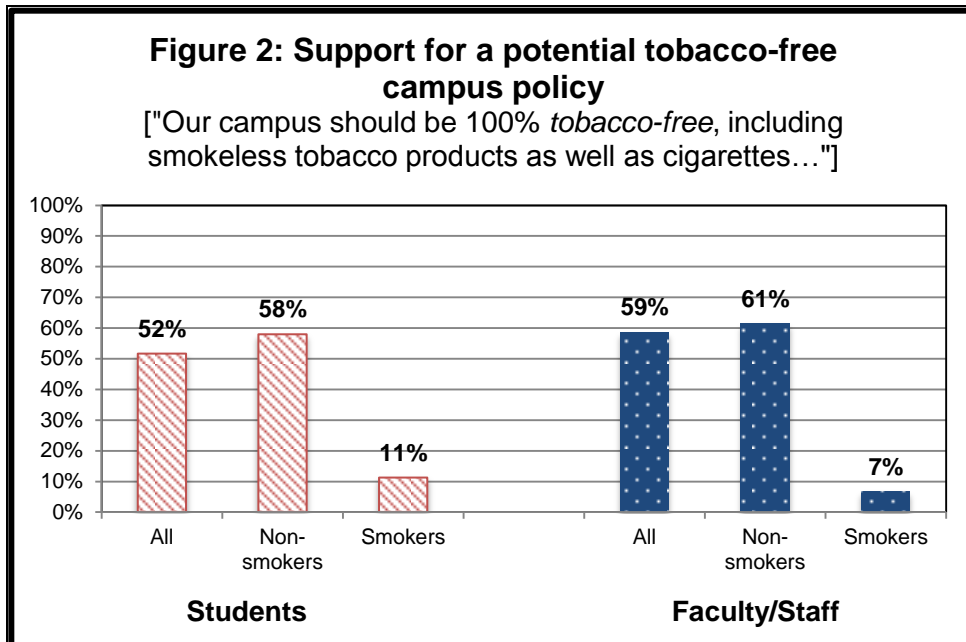
Below are the graphs from the full Smoke Free OSU evaluation report issued in January 2014.

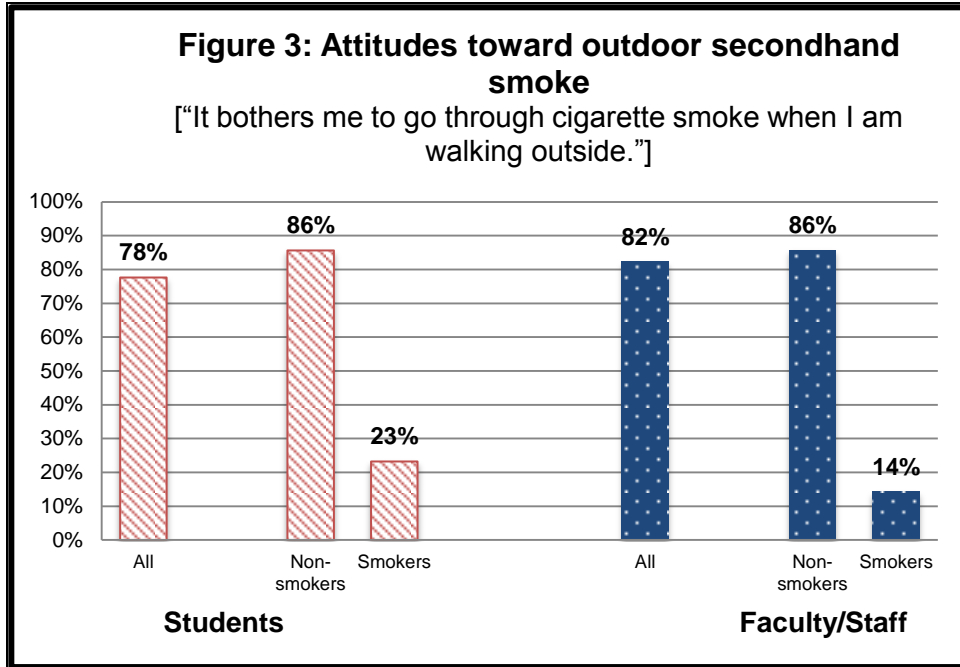

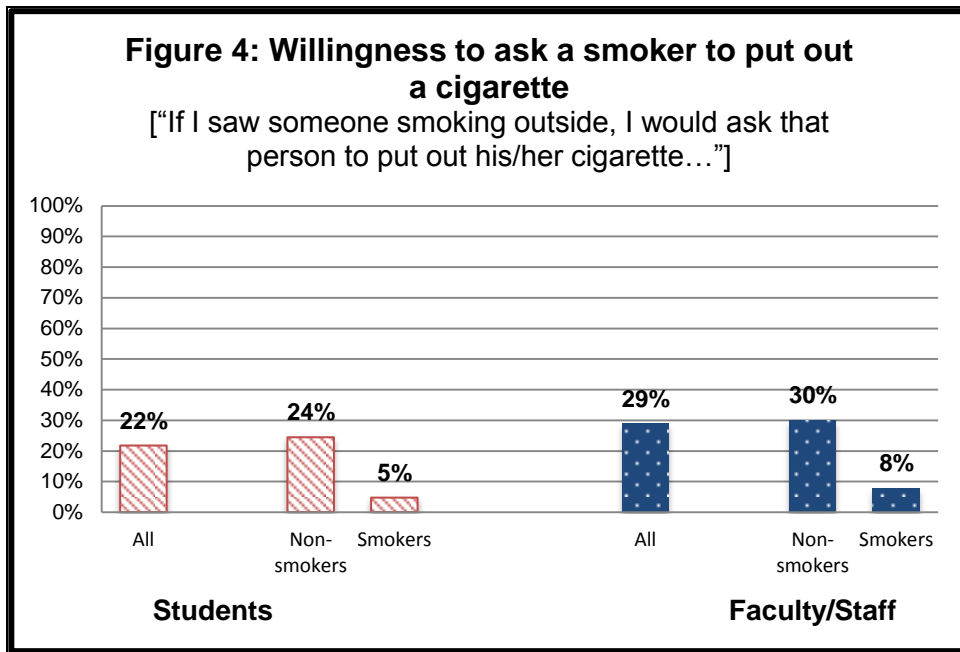
Over 70% of respondents support OSU's smoke-free policy.



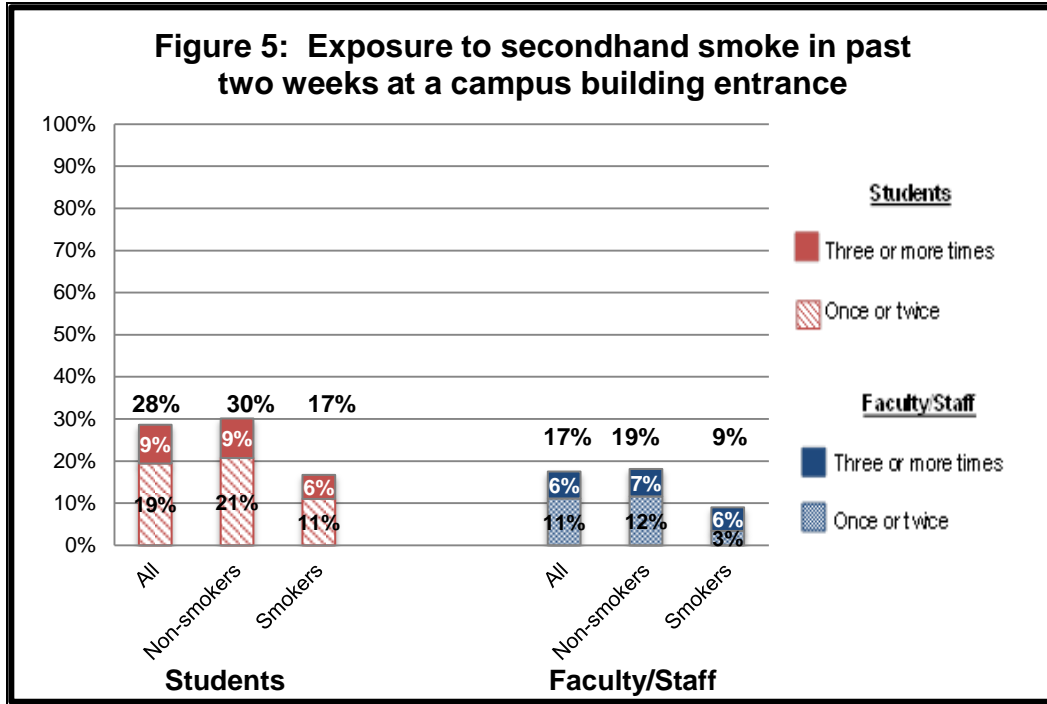
More than half of respondents would support a fully tobacco-free campus policy.



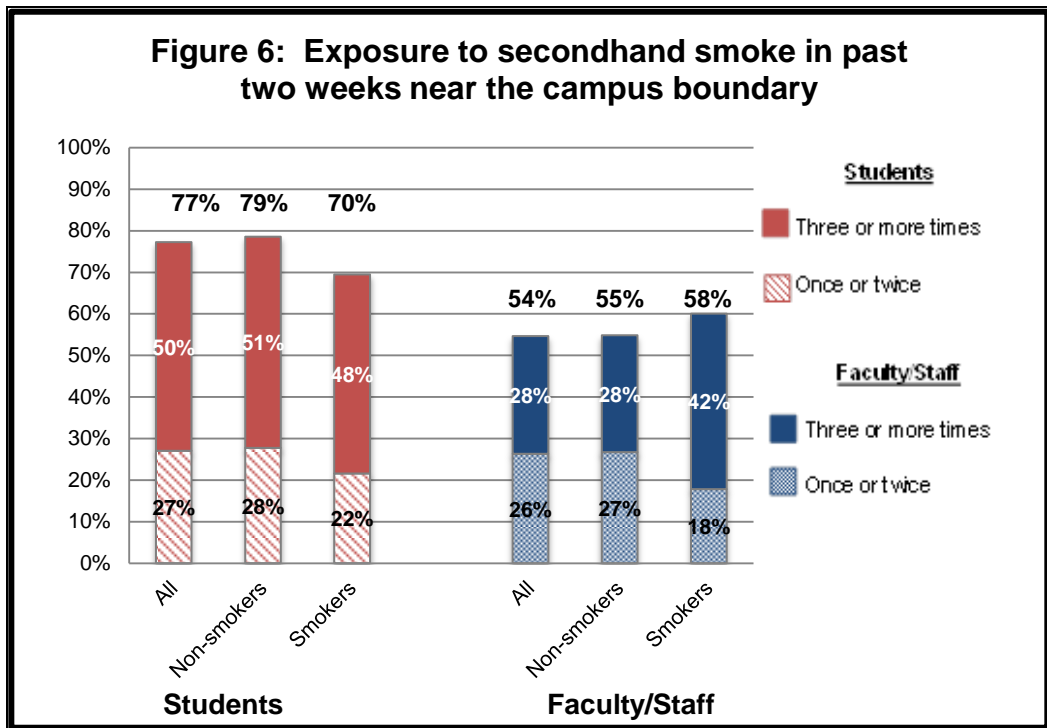
About 80% of respondents are bothered by outdoor cigarette smoke.



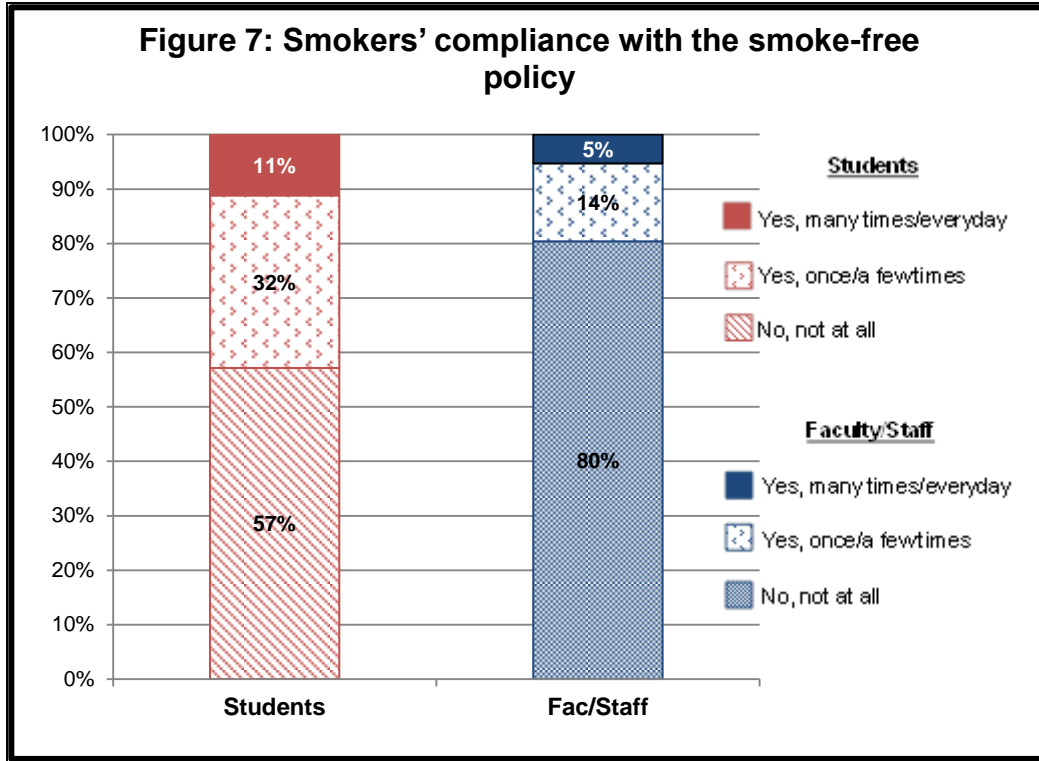
Few respondents would ask a smoker to put out his/her cigarette.



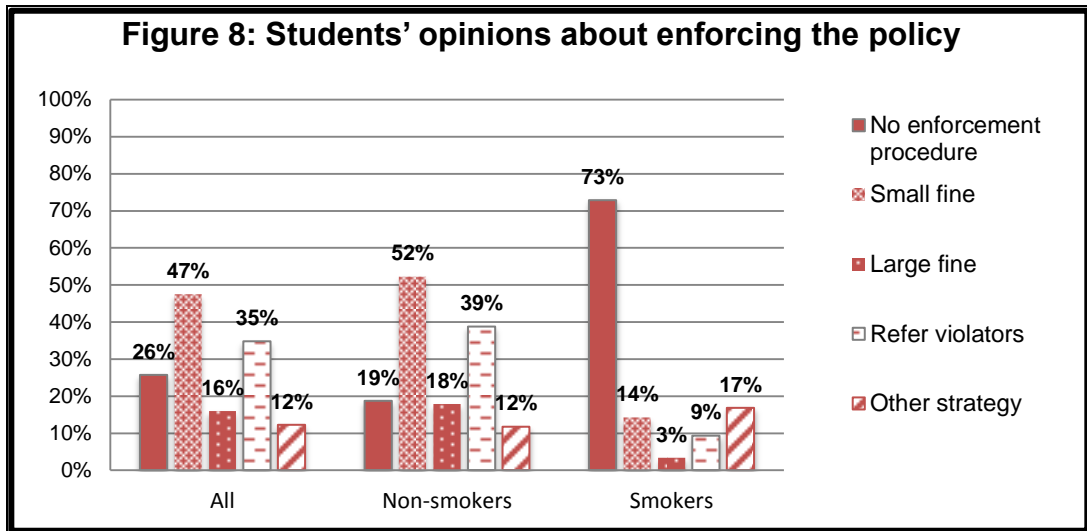
Fewer than 30% of students, and 20% of faculty/staff, were exposed to secondhand smoke at a campus building entrance in the previous two weeks.



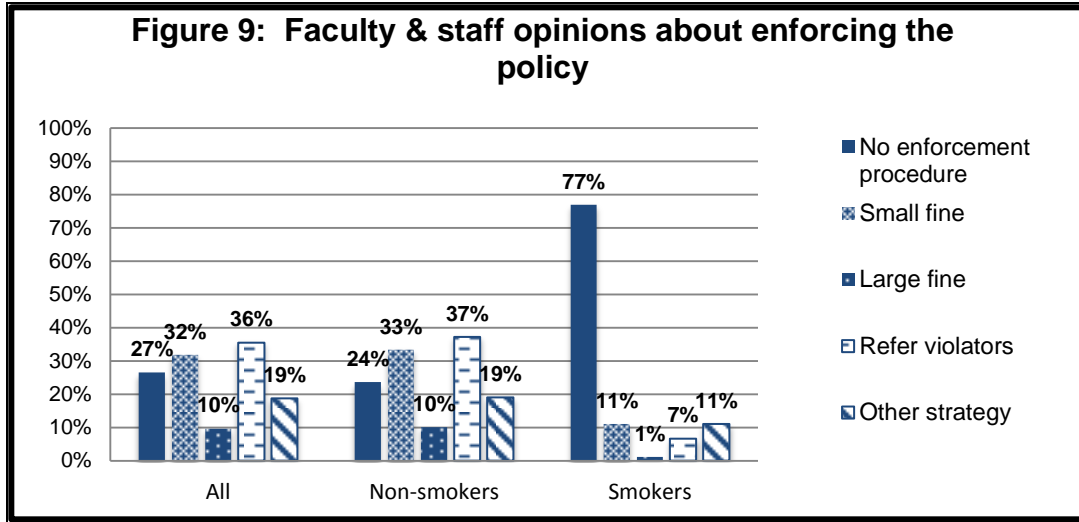
About 75% of students, and more than half of faculty/staff, were exposed to secondhand smoke near the campus boundary in the previous two weeks.



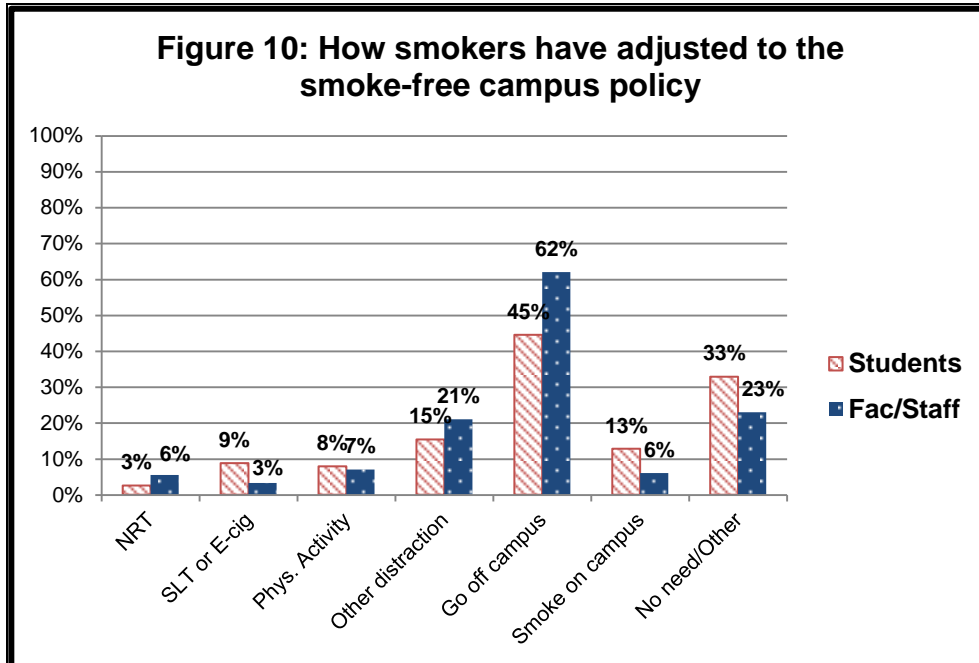
Most student smokers, and 80% of faculty/staff smokers, have not smoked on campus since the policy began.



Levying a small fine is the most popular option overall, but smokers prefer no enforcement.



Referring violators is the most popular option overall, but smokers prefer no enforcement.



Going off campus to smoke is the most frequent response, followed by not having a need to smoke.
